RIGHTS OF THE CHILD

We have previously informed you that we are aiming for the Gold UNICEF Rights Respecting School Award this year. Each week, we focus on one or more of the articles and, starting today, we will be publishing that article in the newsletter so that you can have a chat about it with your child. This week's articles are:

Article 2: The Convention applies to every child without discrimination, whatever their ethnicity, gender, religion, language, abilities or any other status, whatever they think or say, whatever their family background.

Article 13: Every child must be free to express their thoughts and opinions and to access all kinds of information if it is within the law.

Article 17: Every child has the right to reliable information from a variety of sources, and governments should encourage the media to provide information that children can understand. Governments must help protect children from materials that could harm them.
