YEAR 6 START AND END OF DAY

Thank you for bearing with us as we work to make sure the start and end of day procedures are as efficient and safe as they can be. A couple of things we need to clarify about Year 6:

Many of you, understandably, trust your Year 6 children to come to school and go home alone. We support this; it is an important part of growing up and taking responsibility for themselves. Likewise, some of them are ready to take responsibility for collecting younger siblings. A few issues have arisen though. Please note:

- Some Year 6 children have arrived late on occasions, having visited the shop before coming into school.
- Children who go home alone have been asked to leave the site immediately, rather than wait with their friends who are collecting siblings. This is to avoid congestion when Year 4 come out five minutes later.
- Children who do have to collect siblings are asked to wait quietly and sensibly on the playground.
- Year 6 children shouldn't arrive before 8.50am.
 If lots of them arrive earlier than that, it creates congestion and makes social distancing difficult, with lots of infant parents and children, as well as our Year 5s, coming in around that time.

If any of the above become an issue for your child, we will be in touch, and it's possible we may have to ask you to bring your child to school/collect them at the end of the day. However, at the moment, the vast majority of children are cooperating well. Please discuss these matters with your child so that they are clear that you have the same high expectations of them as the school does.

ICY WEATHER

On icy mornings, we feel that the Sandy Lane entrance will be too steep to use safely. Therefore, on such days, we will send a text message to inform you that every child has to come in via the Beeches Road gate. This isn't ideal, but with the staggered start times, we feel it will be the safest option. In the past, any ice has always cleared long before the end of the school day, so we don't anticipate our one-way system being a problem after school.

CONSENT FORMS

This is a last call for consent forms to be sent back in. We can no longer chase these forms, so if your assembly consent form is not sent back, regrettably, your child will be unable to take part in our live Zoom assembly when they win an award. If we haven't received your forms, we will text you and send replacement forms.
