The programme is designed to raise environmental awareness amongst young people and in England it is run by environmental charity Keep Britain Tidy. Internationally, the programme is the largest educational programme in the world present in nearly 70 countries with millions of children participating. Our school is now part of this global community working to create environmental change for the benefit of our children and future generations.

The Eco-Schools programme empowers pupils, raises environmental awareness, improves the school environment and can also lead to financial savings. Being an active member of the programme will be something your child will remember for the rest of their life.

The programme focuses on ten important environmental topics:

- 1. Biodiversity
- 2. Energy
- 3. Global Citizenship
- 4. Healthy Living
- 5. Litter
- 6. Marine
- 7. School Grounds
- 8. Transport
- 9. Waste
- 10. Water

Every school taking part in the Eco-Schools around the world programme follows the same simple Seven Step framework. This usually takes schools between one and two academic years to complete. After achieving our first Green Flag, our school can continue in the programme and achieve multiple Green Flags whilst continuing to work on and promote environmental issues. One of the most exciting things about the programme is that the process is designed to engage the whole school and its wider community.
