The deadline for selecting your child's secondary school is **31st October** and this should be completed online via the Birmingham City Council website. To avoid disappointment, it is advised that you use all six of your selections; otherwise the Local Authority may choose a school for you if your child is unsuccessful in gaining a placement at your preferred choice. If you are hoping to gain a placement at a grammar school and your child is going to complete the grammar tests, the information may differ so it is advised that you read the instructions from the website carefully to ensure you do not miss the deadlines. To prepare your child for secondary school and ensure a smooth transition, homework is strongly encouraged in Year 6. This is an important year and continuous provision at home is a powerful tool that can accelerate your child's progress. We will be sending home Maths and Reading boosters weekly on Thursday to be returned on Tuesday to go through as a class. In addition to this, the children are expected to read five times a week for 20 minutes to be entered into Beeches Brilliant reader. The date and comment about what they have read should be recorded on their bookmark and will be checked and signed by their teacher. A homework club on Tuesday lunchtime will enable children to complete homework that was not completed at home. Thank you in advance for your support!
