COVID-19 UPDATE

Over the past couple of weeks, we have seen an increase in the number of positive cases at school. We have therefore reintroduced some extra measures to try and reduce the risk of it spreading further:

- Staff and visitors are now encouraged to wear masks in communal areas and to observe social distancing.
- Assemblies will be streamed into classrooms.
- All rooms must be well ventilated.
- There will be an increase in the frequency of handwashing.
- All staff are continuing to carry out LFD tests twice per week.

Staff have also been encouraged to get both doses of the Covid-19 vaccination and their booster jabs when they are eligible. Please wear a mask if you are coming into the school building. To help us further, if your child exhibits any symptoms of Covid-19, please book them a PCR test and do not send them into school. We also encourage all households to carry out twice-weekly LFD tests to help detect any asymptomatic cases. We have a limited number of LFD test kits available for families - please ask in the office if you would like one. Thank you for your support and co-operation.
