We looked at different gas masks and sang some WWII songs. The last activity was decoding like intelligence workers used to do when other countries tried to send coded messages. We had to put on some earphones and listen to some codes. These were sent to another aroup to decode them. The hut we were in was used to do this during the actual war all those years ago. We had loads of fun and really enjoyed it.

- Children will not be allowed to eat crisps or chocolate at any time except dinner time. As part of a packed lunch, only small chocolate bars (e.g. Penguins or Clubs) are permitted; larger chocolate bars will be confiscated.
- All confiscated items will be kept for you to collect and we will send you a text message to invite you to collect them. We will not give them back to your child. Any items uncollected after a week will be discarded.
