## READING RECORD

Each child has been given a new reading record. This should be brought into school everyday along with their home reader. Children are required to read five times per week between Friday and the following Thursday. After reading, the children should write a short summary about what they have read to ensure they have understood the text. If a child reads and records a comment five times, they will be entered into our weekly Beeches Brilliant Reader raffle and be in with a chance of winning a brand-new book of their choice. Please encourage your child to read!

## MAIN ENTRANCE

We have noticed an increase in children being brought to/collected from school via the main office entrance, causing congestion. We are a shared site, and it gets very busy with pupils requiring access to the other buildings using this entrance and we must do all we can to keep it safe for them. Congestion also causes a safeguarding concern for our children, as that entrance is not staffed, and children could enter the building without being seen by a member of staff. As of Tuesday, all children will need to be brought to/collected from school via the Beeches Road gate, unless there are extenuating circumstances or your child is attending a booster group, in which case they should be in at 8:30am prompt. If you attempt to bring your child through the main entrance, please do not be offended when you are sent to use the Beeches Road entrance.

If you believe you have extenuating circumstances and need to use the main entrance, please email Mrs. Frances ([e.frances@beechesjnr.bham.sch.uk](mailto:e.frances@beechesjnr.bham.sch.uk)), even where previous permission has been granted. Without this, access through the main entrance will not be permitted.

| <b>English</b> - This term, we will be focusing on developing an understanding of various types of writing genres. Writing learning journeys will be based as much as possible on our topic of the Stone Age. We will cover a range of writing skills including the use of adjectives, conjunctions, a range of punctuation and appropriate vocabulary choices.   |   | <b>Computing</b> - Pupils will be learning how to use animation software to create time-lapse videos and PowerPoint to present information.   |
| <b>Maths</b> - A range of topics, focusing this term on a secure understanding of place value and the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division). We will also be learning about different types of measure and how to calculate with money. As mentioned above, there will be a big focus on rapid recall of times tables and corresponding division facts. Children are expected to learn these for a weekly test to take place every Wednesday.  |   | <b>P.E.</b> – In Outdoor PE, pupils will be learning a range of invasion games skills in order to implement these in rugby. We will be learning team building and problem solving in our outdoor adventure activities.  |
| <b>Science</b> - Our topic in Science this term is 'Let it Shine' where we will be learning about light and shadows.
