PUPIL PREMIUM

You may have noticed that in this newsletter and in other letters recently we have offered reduced rates for children eligible for Pupil Premium for various activities. Children are eligible for Pupil Premium if:

- They have been eligible for free school meals at any time in the last 6 years (not including the universal entitlement to free school meals in the infant school);
- They are, or have ever been, in the care of the Local Authority;
- They are children of service personnel.

If you think this might apply to your child, please come and talk to the office and we can run a quick check to see if your child is eligible. The school receives significant additional funding for these children, which is used in a number of ways, including subsidising costs for them to take part in some activities. 
