PARENT VIEW

During our parents' evenings, we invited parents and carers to fill in "Parent View", Ofsted's online questionnaire. We had 97 responses. The survey results are on the following pages, or you can see them here:

You will need to register, and you should not do this if you have already completed it this academic year.

The feedback was very positive. For example:

- 99% agree that their child is happy at school.
- 99% agree that their child feels safe at school.
- 96% agree that the school makes sure its pupils are well behaved.
- 95% agree that the school has high expectations for their child.
- 98% agree that their child does well at the school.
- 98% agree that a good range of subjects is available to their child.
- 96% agree that their child can take part in clubs and activities at this school.
- 99% would recommend the school to another parent.

These are high percentages, and we thank you for your positive feedback. However, if you do have concerns - if you are in the 1% that wouldn't recommend the school to another parent, or the 4% that feels your child can't take part in clubs and activities, please do get in touch and let us know a bit more about how you are feeling. Unfortunately, Parent View is multiple-choice, so there is no opportunity for people to elaborate on their answers, but we are keen to hear how you feel we can improve. 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

Search results - Beeches Junior School













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
4. My child has been bullied and the school dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively.




























Figures based on 97 responses up to 19-10-2022
