BEECHES BUSY KIDS CLUB (BBKC)

From 17th April 2023, we will no longer be able to accept 'drop-in' pupils at breakfast club or after-school club due to staffing changes. If you would like your child to attend BBKC, their place must be booked in advance using the School Money app. If you need to use the club in an emergency situation and are unable to access the app, please call the school office and we will try to book your child in if there are enough spaces. We apologise for any inconvenience that this may cause but in order to keep everyone safe, children must be booked in to the club in advance. In the morning, please make sure that an adult accompanies your child to the entrance of the club to handover to the club staff. Even if your child is in Year 5 or Year 6, it is vital that an adult brings them to the club door. If children arrive unaccompanied, this will be treated as a safeguarding concern.
