CONTACT DETAILS

SCHOOL MEALS

Please ensure that school meals are ordered for your child by 9am on School Grid. We are often asked to complete the order for you but we are unable to do this. If there is any reason why you are unable to access School Grid, please let us know and we will support you to resolve that. Otherwise, if an order has not been placed online, your child will be offered a jacket potato.

MEDICATIONS IN SCHOOL

A reminder that any medication sent into school needs to be prescribed by a GP and a Consent to Administer Medication form should be completed by parents/carers in order for school staff to administer it. Medication must be sent into school in the original container, including the prescription label, and should only be required in school if the dosage is four or more times per day. Any medications other than those prescribed should not be sent into school including throat sweets, Vicks vapour rub, Vicks inhalers, moisturising cream and eye drops. If your child has an inhaler, EpiPen or allergy medication that is kept in school, please ensure that relevant paperwork has been completed and that you have made a note of the expiry date so that new prescriptions can be ordered when needed.
